## PRESS RELEASE

**Date: Saturday, June 6, 2009**

**Defendant: Ryan P. CRONIN; age 23 of 94 Whitins Road, Sutton, MA 01590-2733**

**Incident: O.U.I. Alcohol, Operating a Motor Vehicle w/a Revoked License, Speeding, Negligent Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Leaving the Scene of a Property Damage Accident, Misleading, Impeding, Delaying an Investigation**

**Defendant: Elisha E. COOLEY-BEAL; age 18 of 3 Pond Street, Douglas, MA 01516**

**Incident: Allowing the Improper Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Misleading, Impeding, Delaying an Investigation**

At 3:15 a.m. Patrolmen Anthony Yannino and Norman Forget responded to a report of a motor vehicle crash in front of 93 North Street. Upon his arrival moments later, Officer Yannino located a female standing outside the involved vehicle while a male subject was seen walking away from the scene in a northerly direction. The male, who was identified as Mr. Cronin, denied any involvement or knowledge of the crash. The female, identified as Ms. Cooley-Beal admitted to driving the vehicle at the time of the crash. The vehicle which was registered to Ms. Cooley-Beal suffered extensive damage after striking a nearby utility pole.

Officer Yannino's initial investigation resulted in Mr. Cronin being placed into protective custody as he was determined to be intoxicated shortly after the crash. The investigation continued and Officer Yannino had the opportunity to speak with additional witnesses in the days to follow. Subsequently, Officer Yannino discovered that Mr. Cronin had been operating the vehicle at the time of the crash but denied his involvement due to his revoked license status and intoxicated condition.

As a result, Officer Yannino submitted applications for complaint with the Uxbridge District Court charging Mr. Cronin and Ms. Cooley-Beal with the aforementioned offenses.

**Defendant: Jeremy J. ANGELL; age 27 of 56 High Street, Apt. 7, North Attleborough, MA**

**Incident: O.U.I. Alcohol, Operating a Motor Vehicle w/a Suspended License, Lights Violation**

At approximately 1:25 a.m. Patrolman Travis Gould stopped a blue Mitsubishi bearing MA Reg. 819BX4 in the area of 15 Martin Road after observing it being driven without taillights and failing to signal a turn. During Officer Gould's initial contact with the operator, who was later identified as Mr. Angell, he made a number of observations giving him reason to suspect that Mr. Angell had recently consumed alcohol. In addition, Officer Gould soon learned that Mr. Angell's right to operate a motor vehicle was suspended. Following additional observations, Officer Gould asked Mr. Angell to perform a number field sobriety tests to determine his condition to continue.

At the conclusion of the tests, Mr. Angell was placed under arrest for Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol. He was handcuffed and transported back to the police station where he was booked accordingly. Mr. Angell became uncooperative during a portion of the booking process when being led into a holding cell and remained so for a short time thereafter.

Mr. Angell was held in custody on cash bail. He was transported to the Uxbridge District Courthouse on Monday morning where he was arraigned on the aforementioned charges.
