Incident: Warrant Arrest

While monitoring the flow of vehicular traffic on Wallum Lake Road, Patrolman Mark Dunleavy ran an inquiry on a vehicle bearing a RI registration. In checking the vehicle's status, Dunleavy learned that the vehicle's registered owner was wanted on an outstanding arrest warrant. Officer Dunleavy stopped the vehicle in question a short distance away and confirmed the operator to be Mr. CANDELARIA. A passenger in the vehicle was identified as Mr. VALENTIN who was also wanted on a separate arrest warrant. Both subjects were arrested and later released on bail.

Incident: Assault w/ a Dangerous Weapon

Douglas officers responded to a report of a disturbance at 45 Cedar Street. Upon arrival, Officer Mark Kaminski met and spoke with the caller Carol Daniel who reported that she had been the victim of an assault at the hands of her husband. Further conversation revealed an argument had taken place between Mrs. Daniel and her husband inside the residence. The argument escalated and resulted in Mr. Daniel allegedly throwing a computer in the direction of his wife.

Officers spoke with Mr. Daniel who was located within the house. He was subsequently placed under arrest and booked accordingly. Mr. Daniel was later bailed and released from custody pending his arraignment in Uxbridge District Court.

Defendant: William MCLELLAN; age 43 of 21 Gilboa Street, Douglas, MA 01516

Incident: Assault and Battery (3 counts), Disorderly Conduct, Disturbing the Peace

Date/Time: Saturday, July 4, 2009 at 10:31 p.m.

Defendant: Yvonne E. BOUTIETTE; age 38 of 21 Gilboa Street, Douglas, MA 01516

Incident: Assault w/ a Dangerous Weapon (3 counts), Disorderly Conduct, Disturbing the Peace

Officers responded to the area of 353 Main Street after police received 2 calls reporting a fight in progress. Upon his arrival, Lt. Nick Miglionico spoke with a witness who directed his attention to a male and female who were seen walking away from the area. The witness pointed to the subjects and identified the male as William MCLELLAN and told Lt. Miglionico that he had been involved in the disturbance. Lt. Miglionico, along with Patrolman George DeGenova made contact with Mr. MCLELLAN and the female who was identified as Ms. BOUTIETTE, both of whom were located walking on Cook Street.

During further investigation, officers learned that Mr. MCLELLAN, Ms. BOUTIETTE and others reportedly arrived uninvited at 353 Main Street where there was a small gathering already ongoing in the rear parking lot. Mr. MCLELLAN and Ms. BOUTIETTE were said to be highly intoxicated at the time of the incident. During their stay a verbal altercation took place between Mr. MCLELLAN and others at the gathering. Allegedly, Mr. MCLELLAN became physically assaultive toward several of the guests at the gathering. He and Ms. BOUTIETTE were asked to leave but refused. During the altercation, witnesses report that Ms. BOUTIETTE also assaulted a number of the guests with a beer bottle while threatening them verbally. Witnesses report that MCLELLAN and BOUTIETTE left only after realizing someone had called police.

During his interaction with Mr. MCLELLAN and Ms. BOUTIETTE, Lt. Miglionico confirmed them to be highly intoxicated. Mr. MCLELLAN and Ms. BOUTIETTE were each placed under arrest and charged accordingly. They were transported to the Douglas Police station where they were booked according to procedure. During booking, Ms. BOUTIETTE was transported to Milford Hospital by Douglas Ambulance; she was later released after an evaluation and transported back to lock-up.

Mr. MCLELLAN and Ms. BOUTIETTE were subsequently released from custody the following day pending their arraignment in Uxbridge District Court.
